Caritas Rehabilitation Service

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Service Background

Early in 2015, Caritas Rehabilitation Service had implemented a two-year pilot scheme on On-site Preschool Rehabilitation Services with the allocation from the Social Welfare Department's Lotteries Fund. Since its regularization in October 2018 with the number of service units increased to 3.5 teams, the service has been renamed to Caritas On-site Pre-school Rehabilitation Services.

Service Objectives


- To offer pre-school clients school- and centerbased services for early intervention;
- To provide **schools** professional advice for the facilitation and management of children with special educational needs;
- To furnish parents/carers with diverse supporting services, so as to equip them with positive attitude and effective skills necessary for nurturing children with special needs.

Target Service Users

- Children under the age of 6, with mild disabilities and attending the participating kindergartens/ kindergarten-cum-child care centers;
 - Children on the waiting list of Social Welfare Department (SWD)'s central referral system are given priority;
 - If there is vacancy, our service teams may exercise flexibility to provide services for children who are waiting for assessment by Child Assessment Centers, provided that the number of these children will not exceed 10% of the team's service capacity.
- 2. Teachers, child care workers, and parents/ caregivers of the participating kindergartens/ kindergarten-cum-child care centers.

Scope of Services

- 1. To offer children with special needs:
 - developmental assessments and tailor-made individual treatment plans;
 - school-based individual/ group treatment sessions;
 - treatment sessions at centers with rehabilitation facilities;
- 2. To provide teachers/child care workers with:
 - on-site professional consultations, demonstrations, professional talks, workshops, and seminars, etc.;
- 3. To furnish **parents/carers** with: consultations, home practice suggestions, talks, workshops, etc.



Application Methods

Application can be made via referrals made by social workers of:

- Child Assessment Centers (CACs) under the Department of Health or Hospital Authority or staff of rehabilitation service units to the Central Referral System for Rehabilitation Services of the Social Welfare Department (SWD);
- Integrated Family Service Centers (IFSCs) to the Central Referral System for Rehabilitation Services of the Social Welfare Department (SWD) after the child has undergone assessment by a recognized authority/profession.

Special Remarks

Potential clients attending/going to attend the participating kindergartens or kindergarten-cum-child care centers, currently on the waiting list of the Central Referral System for Rehabilitation Services of SWD and intending to apply for our service, may want to notify the social workers of CACs/IFSCs promptly for referrals.
